2025 GAPC Certification Application

All growers involved in the GAPC Certification program must apply annually to maintain their certification.

The application period is from January 15, 2025, to April 15, 2025.

Applications submitted after April 15 are subject to a late fee.

Consultants are not GAPC employees and using a consultant does not guarantee Certification will be granted. Rather, they are well versed in all things Certification and have completed detailed training from GAPC to help educate their growers. H-2A Program

The Office of Foreign Labor Certification is making available program factsheets displaying key selected statistics about each of our major immigration programs. These factsheets include cumulative information and are updated on a quarterly basis.



OSHA Reporting

Reminder to Growers: Post 2024 OSHA 300A and Complete Electronic Reporting GAPC Newsletter January and February

The OSHA Form 300A (Summary of work-related Injuries and Illnesses) for 2024 must be posted from February 1 through April 30, 2025, in a central location on the operation.

If your operation meets the following criteria, **YOU MUST** electronically submit data.



- 1. **20-249 workers** and in agriculture, forestry, fishing and hunting (NAICS 11) <u>Appendix A to Subpart E of 29 CFR Part 1904</u>. You must electronically submit the OSHA Form 300A.
- 2. **100 or more workers** in agriculture, forestry, fishing and hunting (NAICS 11) <u>Appendix B to Subpart E of 29 CFR Part 1904</u>. You must electronically submit OSHA Forms 300 and 301.

OSHA collects work-related injury and illness data through the Injury Tracking Application (ITA). Growers meeting the above criteria must provide 2024 injury and illness data to OSHA by March 2, 2025.

Where: Wilson County Agricultural Center, 1806 SW Goldsboro St., Wilson, NC 27893


Agenda:
