GAPC Certification Program (Tobacco)

LABOR MANAGEMENT: TRAINING It is important to train workers on barn safety prior to them working to hang or remove tobacco from the barn. This may have been covered by a grower when providing training under the General Farm Safety and Safe Operation of Farm Equipment and Machinery topic, however, by specifically listing the topic separately it will bring further awareness of the importance of the topic and provide further documentation of the critical training. An appendix has been added to both the compliance guide and the standards document that describes the content included in each training topic. The content of **Purpose** that Appendix can be found beginning on page 2 of this document. <u>Appendix of Required Training Descriptions</u> (added to the compliance guide and standards document in 2025)

- **Heat Illness and Heat Illness Prevention**: How to identify heat illness symptoms, how heat illness affects an individual's health and safety, how to protect oneself from heat illness and other preventive measures, and review of operation's heat illness prevention plan, if available.
- General Farm Safety and Safe Operation of Farm Equipment and Machinery: The
 importance of being aware of and able to identify farm safety risks on the operation. Identifying
 farm equipment and machinery hazards, learn tips to prevent safety risks and hazards on
 equipment and machinery including Rollover Protection Standards (ROPS) and machine
 safeguarding operating instructions.
- **First Aid:** Basic steps in providing first aid in the event of an emergency or non-emergency injury or illness, identifying the location of first aid kits, recognizing an emergency, distinguishing the difference between life threatening and non-life-threatening emergencies and emergency action steps (check, call, care).

- Carbon Monoxide Poisoning Prevention: Carbon monoxide is a poisonous gas that has no smell or taste. Breathing it in can make you unwell, and it can kill if exposed to high levels.
 Smoke inhalation during a fire can cause carbon monoxide poisoning. Information for workers to learn what is Carbon Monoxide Poisoning, how to identify symptoms, preventative steps, and emergency response.
- Pesticide Safety: Preventive information and practices to protect workers from pesticide poisoning and injury. Including the sources and routes of pesticide exposure, identifying the symptoms of pesticide exposure, recognizing and explaining the meaning of warning signs in the fields, taking appropriate actions to prevent overexposure and apply routine and emergency decontamination procedures. This topic will also include the recognition of Restricted Entry Interval (REI) and the proper procedures of storage, handling, application, and disposal of CPAs.
- **Use of Personal Protective Equipment (PPE):** Discuss when PPE is necessary, different types of PPE required, limitations of PPE, and proper care and maintenance of PPE.
- **Green Tobacco Sickness (GTS):** How to recognize GTS symptoms, how to prevent GTS, how to administer proper emergency response to GTS symptoms.
- Farm Emergency Plan and Emergency Response: Discuss different types of natural and man-made emergencies, understand the risks in these emergencies, discuss procedures in place, and a communication plan to report emergencies.
- NTRM Prevention: Define NTRM, the importance of recognizing NTRM, and how to prevent it.
